





New student literary competition announced to commemorate Velvet Revolution anniversary

Prague, May 20, 2024 – Students of secondary schools and universities in Czechia and Slovakia have the opportunity to take part in a new literary competition commemorating the 35th anniversary of the Velvet Revolution. They may submit an essay, reportage, or short story in English on any topic related to the legacy of the Revolution. The deadlines is June 30, 2024.

The competition is open to all students in two age categories: under 18 and 19 to 26. The jury includes AAU lecturers, authors, and public figures with a connection to the events of November 17, 1989, such as Monika MacDonagh-Pajerová and Martin Klíma.

Anglo-American University (AAU), who organizes the event in partnership with Memory of Nations (Paměť národa), Media:list, Korejzova Legal, Fomoso, Sportisimo and Albatros Media under the auspices of the US and British embassies, plans to announce the winners this fall.

In addition to the publication of their writing in an anthology, students can also win other interesting prizes from the partners, such as internships or scholarships covering tuition fees for undergraduate or graduate studies.
